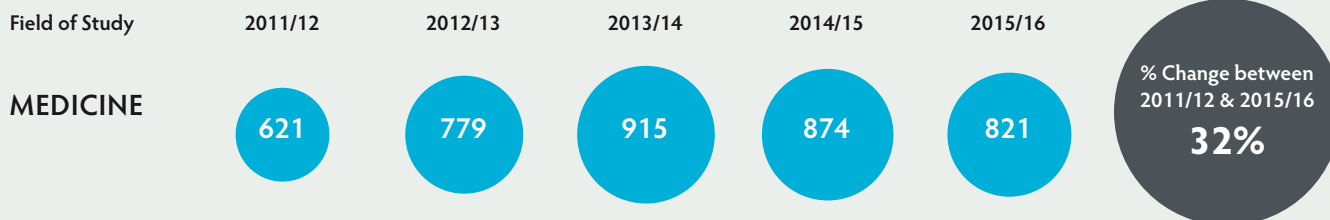
MEDICINE NEW ENTRANTS

Full-time Medicine New Entrants, 2011/12 - 2015/16



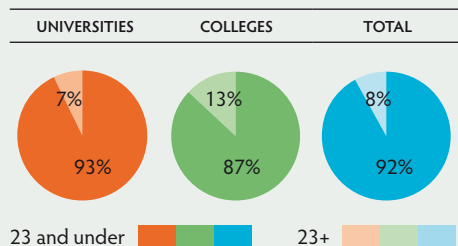
Who are Medicine New Entrants in 2015/16?



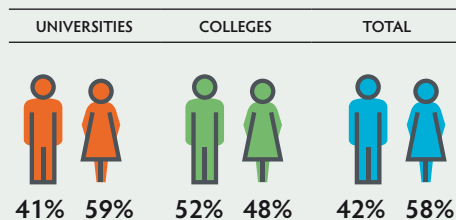
14% of Irish Medicine new entrants are in receipt of a SUSI grant in 2015/16. This compares to 46% of all Irish new entrants in the same year.

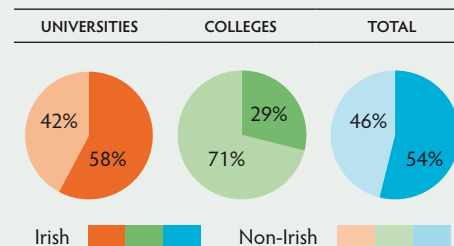
BY AGE, 2015/16



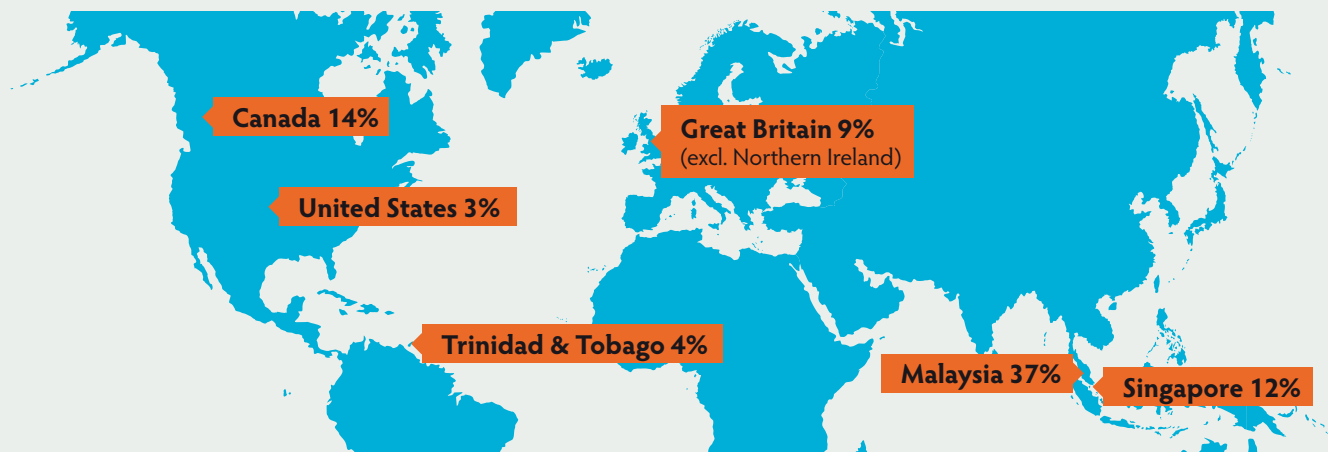
BY GENDER, 2015/16

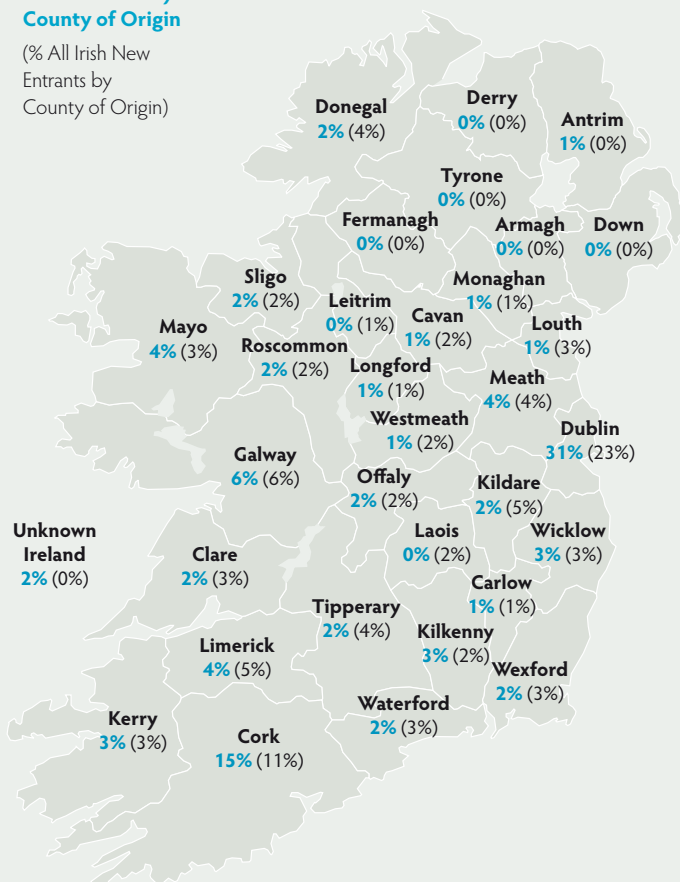
Non-Irish Medicine New Entrants by Domiciliary of Origin, 2015/16

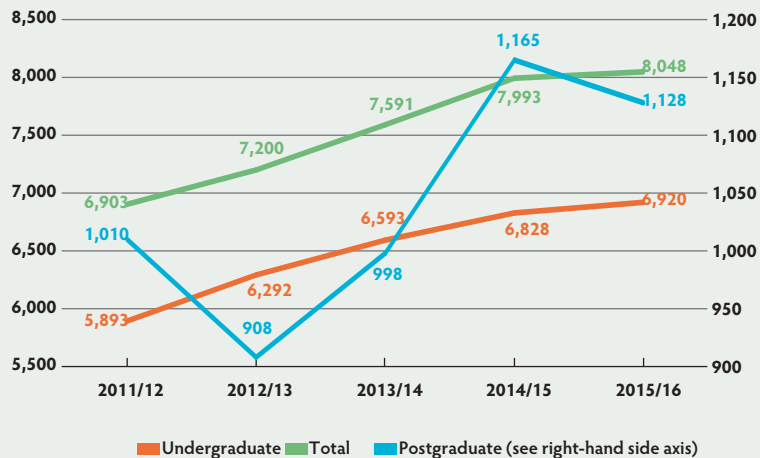

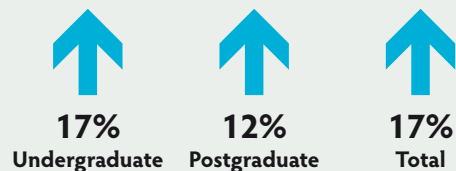

Who Enrolled in Full-Time Undergraduate Medicine Courses in 2015/16?

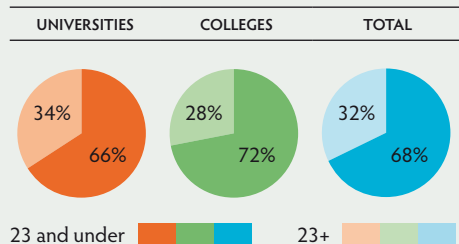

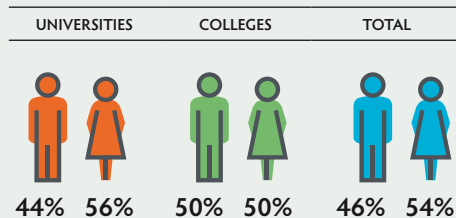

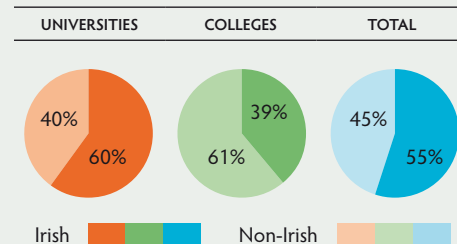
BY AGE, 2015/16

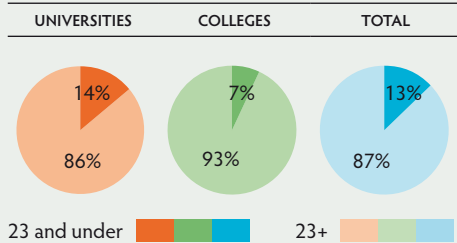

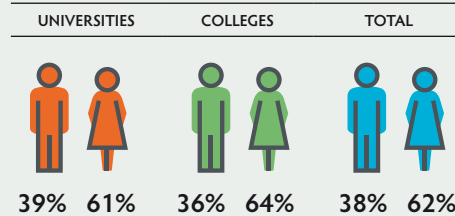

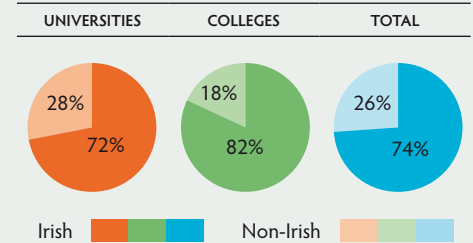
BY AGE, 2015/16

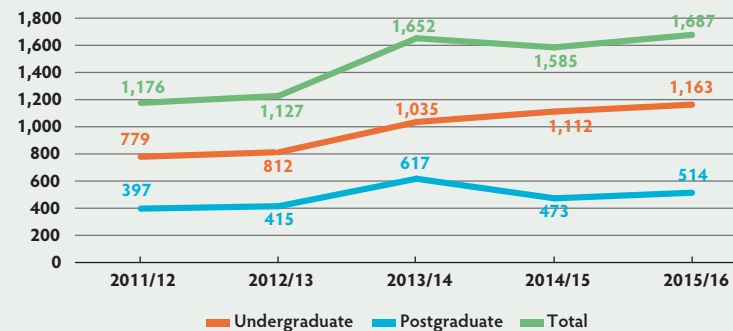

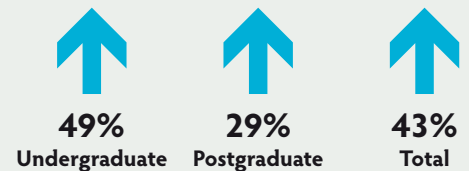
