Medical Schools In Ireland

There are five medical schools in Ireland:

- Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland (RCSI)
- Trinity College Dublin (TCD)
- University College Cork (UCD)
- University College Dublin (UCC)
- University of Galway (UG)
- University of Limerick (UL)

All except University of Limerick provide entry routes for school leavers.

University of Limerick offers a graduate entry programme, as does UCC, UCD and RSCI.

Socio-Economic Background

- About 33% of Medicine students are from affluent backgrounds, compared with 18% overall
- Only 3% of medicine students are from disadvantaged backgrounds, compared to 11% overall

PROGRESSION



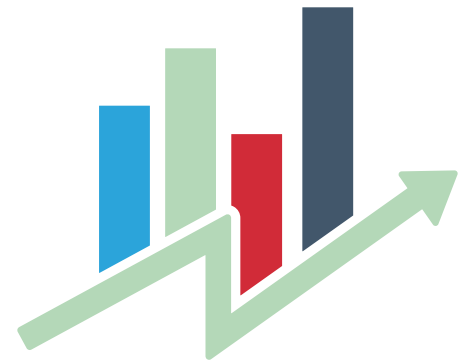
Undergraduate medicine has one of the highest levels of progression: **97%** of undergraduate new entrants to medicine progressed to the following academic year compared to 86% of new entrants to undergraduate degree courses overall.

GRADUATES AND OUTCOMES



Graduates

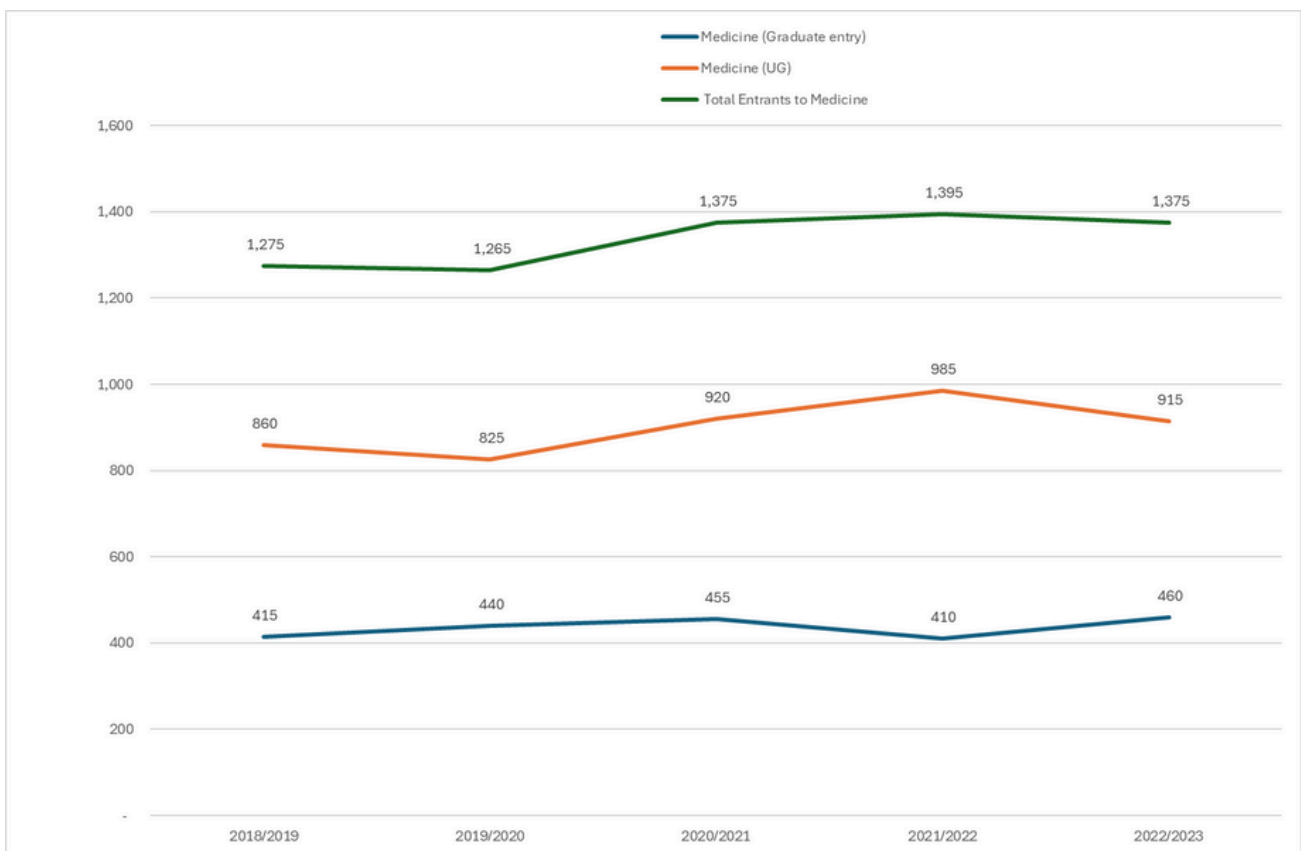
- There were approximately 1,250 Medicine graduates in 2022
- 51% were Irish domiciled; 45% were non-EU Domiciled



- 99% of Medicine Graduates were in employment nine months after graduation
- 99% of Irish Domiciled graduates were employed in Ireland
- 49% of Non-EU Domiciled Graduates were employed in Ireland
